

Matthew Kofi Waldren Conductor



Born in Geneva into a family of mixed British and Ghanaian heritage, Matthew Kofi Waldren has become one of the UK's leading classical conductors. His energetic, collaborative yet detailed approach to musical leadership has resulted in invitations to work in concert and opera with the UK's finest orchestras, opera houses and conservatories. He is particularly well known for his work conducting opera, and has conducted world, and UK premieres as well as much of the core repertoire with the UK's major opera companies. He is known as a specialist in Italian opera and in 2024 was asked to curate a programme celebrating Puccini's centenary for BBC's Friday Night is Music Night. He was nominated at the International Opera Awards (2017), whilst his work at ENO has been twice nominated at the Olivier Awards (*Blue* 2024, *Paul Bunyan* 2019) and the Black British Theatre Awards (*Blue* 2023).

As co-founder of Your Turn Collective he is known as a passionate advocate for widening access in classical music - for audiences, participants and potential professionals - whilst as a member of the City of London Sinfonia Artists Council he is at the forefront of helping to shape and define the identity, mission, and output of an orchestra in the 21st century.
